AN ACT

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and 1 Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, further 3 providing for definitions; and, in particular rights and immunities, further providing for civil immunity for use of force and providing for declarative and injunctive relief and 5 6 certain damages. 8 The General Assembly finds that: It is proper for law-abiding people to protect 9 themselves, their families and others from intruders and 10 11 attackers without fear of prosecution or civil action for 12 acting in defense of themselves and others. 13 Section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of 14 Pennsylvania quarantees that the "right of the citizens to 15 bear arms in defense of themselves and the State shall not be 16 questioned." 17 Commonwealth law currently limits regulation of 18 firearms, ammunition and ammunition components by political 19 subdivisions in order to further the right quaranteed by

section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

- 1 (4) Unlawful regulation of firearms, ammunition and
- 2 ammunition components by political subdivisions and the
- 3 threat of citation, prosecution or other legal process posed
- 4 by such regulation interfere with this right.
- 5 (5) Such interference with the right guaranteed by
- 6 section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of Pennsylvania
- 7 unduly inhibits law-abiding people from protecting
- 8 themselves, their families and others from intruders and
- 9 attackers and from other legitimate uses of constitutionally
- 10 protected arms, including hunting and sporting activities.
- 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 12 hereby enacts as follows:
- 13 Section 1. Section 6102 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 14 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read:
- 15 § 6102. Definitions.
- 16 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
- 17 provisions of this subchapter which are applicable to specific
- 18 provisions of this subchapter, the following words and phrases,
- 19 when used in this subchapter shall have, unless the context
- 20 clearly indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this
- 21 section:
- 22 "Ammunition components."
- 23 <u>(1) The individual components of a fixed cartridge or</u>
- shotgun shell, including, but not limited to, casings,
- 25 primers and projectiles.
- 26 (2) A propellant used in ammunition.
- 27 (3) A projectile or propellant used in antique firearms
- as defined in section 6118 (relating to antique firearms).

- 30 Section 2. Section 8340.2 of Title 42 is amended to read:

- 1 § 8340.2. Civil immunity for use of force or persons adversely
- 2 affected by unlawful regulation of firearms.
- 3 (a) General rule <u>for use of force</u>.--An actor who uses force:
- 4 (1) in self-protection as provided in 18 Pa.C.S. § 505
- 5 (relating to use of force in self-protection);
- 6 (2) in the protection of other persons as provided in 18
- 7 Pa.C.S. § 506 (relating to use of force for the protection of
- 8 other persons);
- 9 (3) for the protection of property as provided in 18
- 10 Pa.C.S. § 507 (relating to use of force for the protection of
- 11 property);
- 12 (4) in law enforcement as provided in 18 Pa.C.S. § 508
- 13 (relating to use of force in law enforcement); or
- 14 (5) consistent with the actor's special responsibility
- for care, discipline or safety of others as provided in 18
- Pa.C.S. § 509 (relating to use of force by persons with
- special responsibility for care, discipline or safety of
- 18 others)
- 19 is justified in using such force and shall be immune from civil
- 20 liability for personal injuries sustained by a perpetrator which
- 21 were caused by the acts or omissions of the actor as a result of
- 22 the use of force.
- 23 (a.1) General rule for unlawful regulation of firearms.--A
- 24 person adversely affected by any manner of regulation
- 25 promulgated or enforced in violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 6120(a)
- 26 (relating to limitation on the regulation of firearms and
- 27 <u>ammunition</u>) or 53 Pa.C.S. § 2962(g) (relating to limitation on
- 28 municipal powers) may seek declarative and injunctive relief and
- 29 the actual and consequential damages attributable to the
- 30 violation in an appropriate court.

- 1 (b) Attorney fees and costs.--
- 2 <u>(1)</u> If the actor who satisfies the requirements of
- 3 subsection (a) prevails in a civil action initiated by or on
- 4 behalf of a perpetrator against the actor, the court shall
- 5 award reasonable expenses to the actor. [Reasonable expenses
- 6 shall include, but not be limited to, attorney fees, expert
- 7 witness fees, court costs and compensation for loss of
- 8 income.1
- 9 <u>(2) The court shall award reasonable expenses to a</u>
- 10 person adversely affected if an action under subsection (a.1)
- 11 <u>results in:</u>
- (i) a final determination by a court in favor of the
- 13 <u>person adversely affected; or</u>
- 14 <u>(ii) rescission or repeal of the challenged manner</u>
- of regulation or enforcement after suit has been filed
- 16 <u>under subsection (a.1) but prior to a final determination</u>
- by a court.
- 18 (c) [Definition.--As used in this section, the term
- 19 "perpetrator" shall mean a person against whom an actor is
- 20 justified in using force as provided by 18 Pa.C.S. § 505, 506,
- 21 507, 508 or 509.] Definitions.--As used in this section, the
- 22 following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to
- 23 them in this subsection unless the context clearly indicates
- 24 otherwise:
- 25 "Perpetrator." A person against whom an actor is justified
- 26 in using force as provided by 18 Pa.C.S. § 505, 506, 507, 508 or
- 27 <u>509.</u>
- 28 "Person adversely affected." Any of the following:
- 29 <u>(1) A person who has standing under the laws of this</u>
- 30 Commonwealth to bring an action under subsection (a.1).

1	(2) A resident of this Commonwealth who may legally
2	possess a firearm under the laws of this Commonwealth and the
3	United States and either:
4	(i) is subject to any manner of regulation alleged
5	to be promulgated or enforced in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.
6	§ 6120(a) or of 53 Pa.C.S. § 2962(g) whether or not
7	specific enforcement action has been initiated or
8	threatened against the person or another person; or
9	(ii) would be, if the person were present in the
10	political subdivision in question, subject to any manner
11	of regulation alleged to be promulgated or enforced in
12	violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 6120(a) or of 53 Pa.C.S. §
13	2962(g) whether or not specific enforcement action has
14	been initiated or threatened against the person or
15	another person.
16	(3) A membership organization, the members of which
17	include a person described under paragraph (1) or (2).
18	"Reasonable expenses." The term includes, but is not limited
19	to, attorney fees, expert witness fees, court costs and
20	compensation for loss of income.
21	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
