A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4	Urging the Congress of the United States and the President of the United States to pass and sign, respectively, legislation that would reinstate a Federal assault weapons and high- capacity magazine ban.
5	WHEREAS, High-capacity magazines are often used in gun crimes
6	and police murders; and
7	WHEREAS, Mass shootings frequently involve the use of assault
8	weapons and high-capacity magazines; and
9	WHEREAS, The Federal Bureau of Investigation defines "mass
10	shooting" as one in which at least four people are murdered with
11	a gun; and
12	WHEREAS, According to "Analysis of Mass Shootings 2009-2013,"
13	conducted by Mayors Against Illegal Guns, 56 mass shootings were
14	identified in 30 states; and
15	WHEREAS, Assault weapons or high-capacity magazines were used
16	in at least 23% of the mass shootings identified, which is
17	disproportionate to their use in overall crime, generally
18	estimated at 2% overall; and
19	WHEREAS, Mass shootings in which assault weapons or high-

1 capacity magazines were used resulted in an average of 14.8
2 people shot or a total of 135% more than are shot in other
3 incidents; and

WHEREAS, Mass shootings in which assault weapons or highcapacity magazines were used resulted in an average of eight deaths or 57% more deaths than in other incidents; and WHEREAS, National legislation regulating semiautomatic assault weapons will provide a uniform framework of weapon availability across the nation in place of a patchwork variation across the United States; therefore be it

11 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the 12 General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the 13 Congress of the United States and the President of the United 14 States to pass and sign, respectively, legislation that would 15 reinstate a Federal assault weapons and high-capacity magazine 16 ban.
