A RESOLUTION

Urging the Congress of the United States to take immediate action to stop the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and 2 Explosives from implementing its new framework for 3 determining whether certain projectiles are "primarily intended for sporting purposes" within the meaning of 18 5 U.S.C. 921(a)(17)(C). 6 7 WHEREAS, The second amendment to the Constitution of the United States and section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of 8 Pennsylvania recognize the right of residents of this Commonwealth to keep and bear arms for self-defense; and 10 WHEREAS, In further recognition of the fundamental right to 11 12 keep and bear arms, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has a comprehensive set of gun laws and regulations that are focused 13 14 on keeping guns out of the hands of criminals and other 15 prohibited individuals while respecting the freedoms of lawful 16 and responsible gun owners throughout this Commonwealth; and 17 WHEREAS, The drop in violent crime and violent firearm 18 offenses in recent years in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 19 demonstrates the effectiveness of the Commonwealth's qun laws

- 2 WHEREAS, The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and
- 3 Explosives (ATF) recently announced its new framework for
- 4 determining whether certain projectiles are "primarily intended
- 5 for sporting purposes" within the meaning of 18 U.S.C. 921(a)
- 6 (17)(C); and
- 7 WHEREAS, The framework demonstrates an utter disdain for
- 8 lawful gun owners and manufacturers by equating them with
- 9 criminals by:
- 10 (1) discussing "individual consumers, whether they are
- 11 law-abiding citizens or criminals";
- 12 (2) identifying "criminals" as "one class of potential
- consumer group"; and
- 14 (3) stating that "the intent of one group of potential
- 15 consumers (criminals) is no more determinative than the
- intent of manufacturers";
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, The immediate effect of the framework is to overturn
- 19 a longstanding determination that a particular type of
- 20 ammunition is primarily intended for sporting purposes in order
- 21 to ban its production, importation, sale and distribution; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Handguns that utilize the particular ammunition
- 23 targeted by the framework are large and cumbersome and not
- 24 "handguns designed to be carried and concealed," which is a
- 25 standard offered in defense of the framework; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The ATF's determination under the framework that
- 27 only large, "single-shot handguns" serve a sporting purpose
- 28 directly conflicts with all of the following:
- 29 (1) The definition of "firearm" under 18 Pa.C.S. § 6102
- 30 (relating to definitions).

- 1 (2) The provisions of 18 Pa.C.S. § 6106(c) (relating to
- 2 firearms not to be carried with a license).
- 3 (3) The provisions of 34 Pa.C.S. §§ 2308 (relating to
- 4 unlawful devices and methods) and 2322 (relating to
- 5 prohibited devices and methods);
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, The framework conflates the general rule with the
- 8 sporting purposes exemption in a manner to render the exemption
- 9 almost meaningless; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The long-term effect of the framework leaves
- 11 unelected, unaccountable Federal agency employees with the
- 12 authority to significantly impair the ability of the residents
- 13 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to exercise their
- 14 fundamental right to self-defense by, with the stroke of a pen,
- 15 prohibiting the manufacture, import, sale and distribution of a
- 16 particular type of ammunition; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 18 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the ATF to end its
- 19 consideration of the currently proposed framework in favor of a
- 20 framework that respects constitutional rights and is in
- 21 compliance with Federal and State law; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 23 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Congress of the United
- 24 States to take immediate action to stop the ATF from
- 25 implementing its new framework for determining whether certain
- 26 projectiles are "primarily intended for sporting purposes"
- 27 within the meaning of 18 U.S.C. 921(a)(17)(C); and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the Chief Clerk of the House of
- 29 Representatives transmit copies of this resolution to the Bureau
- 30 of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives and to each member

1 of Congress from Pennsylvania.
