| 13 | (a) Offense definedA person is guilty of disorderly |
| 14 | conduct if, with intent to cause public inconvenience, annoyance |
| 15 | or alarm, or recklessly creating a risk thereof, he: |
| 16 | (1) engages in fighting or threatening, or in violent or |
| 17 | tumultuous behavior; |
| 18 | (2) makes unreasonable noise; |
| 19 | (3) uses obscene language, or makes an obscene gesture; |

(4) creates a hazardous or physically offensive
 condition by any act which serves no legitimate purpose of
 the actor[.]; or

4 (5) operates an unmanned aircraft in dangerous proximity
5 to another person or another person's property, unless the
6 other person consents to the operation.

7 (b) Grading.--An offense under this section is a misdemeanor 8 of the third degree if the intent of the actor is to cause 9 substantial harm or serious inconvenience, or if he persists in 10 disorderly conduct after reasonable warning or request to 11 desist. Otherwise disorderly conduct is a summary offense.

12 (c) Definition.--[As used in this section the word "public" 13 means affecting] <u>The following words and phrases as used in this</u> 14 <u>section shall have the meaning given to them in this subsection</u> 15 <u>unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>

16 <u>"Public." Affecting</u> or likely to affect persons in a place 17 to which the public or a substantial group has access; among the 18 places included are highways, transport facilities, schools, 19 prisons, apartment houses, places of business or amusement, any 20 neighborhood, or any premises which are open to the public.

21 <u>"Unmanned aircraft." As defined in section 5518 (relating to</u> 22 <u>unlawful use of unmanned aircraft).</u>

25 (a) Offense defined.--A person commits the offense of
 26 unlawful use of an unmanned aircraft if the person knowingly

27 uses an unmanned aircraft to conduct surveillance of, gather

28 evidence or collect information about or photographically or

29 <u>electronically record a critical facility without the prior</u>

30 written consent of the owner of the critical facility.
