AN ACT

Amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in municipal police education and 2 training, further providing for powers and duties of 3 commission and establishing the Police Department Grant Program; and making a related repeal. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 2164 of Title 53 of the Pennsylvania 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read: § 2164. Powers and duties of commission. 10 11 The powers and duties of the commission shall be as follows: 12 (17) To require minimum standards for training police 13 14 officers on domestic violence. The training shall include 15 standards for assessing the lethality risk of domestic 16 violence incidents. As used in this paragraph, the term 17 "police officer" also includes a member of the Pennsylvania State Police or a county sheriff's office. 18

Section 2. Title 53 is amended by adding a section to read:

- 1 § 2172. Police Department Grant Program.
- 2 (a) Establishment. -- The Police Department Grant Program is
- 3 established and shall be administered by the center.
- 4 (b) Purpose of grants. -- The center shall award grants to
- 5 <u>eliqible police departments. Grant funds may be used for the</u>
- 6 <u>following:</u>
- 7 (1) Vehicle acquisition.
- 8 (2) Cameras, including cameras to be placed in vehicles.
- 9 <u>(3) Speed timing devices.</u>
- 10 (4) Uniforms.
- 11 (5) Police and emergency equipment.
- 12 (6) Training, including domestic violence training.
- 13 <u>(7) Personnel costs.</u>
- 14 <u>(8) Community law enforcement efforts.</u>
- (c) Pennsylvania State Police and county sheriff's
- 16 offices. -- The Pennsylvania State Police and county sheriff's
- 17 offices shall be eligible for a grant under this section for
- 18 domestic violence training in order to fund the training
- 19 required under section 2164(17) (relating to powers and duties
- 20 of commission).
- 21 (d) Application and review. --
- 22 (1) The center shall notify police departments of the
- 23 <u>availability of the program by July 1 for fiscal years</u>
- beginning after June 30, 2016.
- 25 (2) The center shall develop and distribute a uniform
- application for police departments to submit for grants under
- 27 <u>the program. The center shall provide the application form</u>
- and accompanying instructions to police departments annually
- by September 1.
- 30 (3) To be considered, an application must be submitted

- to the center no later than November 30 of each fiscal year.
- 2 The center shall approve or disapprove an application within
- 3 60 days of the application being filed.
- 4 (4) The center shall review applications submitted for
- 5 grants under the program and shall approve them if they meet
- 6 <u>the requirements of paragraph (5) and the police department</u>
- 7 agrees to the terms and conditions for the grant as
- 8 <u>determined by the center. A police department must submit a</u>
- 9 <u>signed agreement to the center prior to the release of grant</u>
- 10 funds to the police department.
- 11 (5) Grants shall be awarded based upon the demonstrated
- 12 <u>need of the police department requesting the grant.</u>
- 13 (e) Conditions.--
- 14 (1) A police department that fails to return a signed
- agreement for the preceding fiscal year is ineligible for
- 16 grant funding in the current fiscal year unless the police
- 17 department provides to the center a reasonable written
- 18 explanation as to why the police department failed to claim
- 19 its grant.
- 20 (2) A police department that fails to demonstrate that
- 21 <u>it complied with all the terms of its agreement for the</u>
- 22 preceding fiscal year is ineligible for grant funding in the
- 23 current fiscal year.
- 24 <u>(f)</u> Funding.--
- 25 (1) Annually, the sum of \$2,000,000 shall be transferred
- from the State Gaming Fund to the department for the purpose
- of issuing grants.
- 28 (2) No money from the transfer under paragraph (1) may
- 29 be used for expenses or costs incurred by the department for
- 30 the administration of the program.

- 1 (g) Report. -- Within six months of receiving a grant, a
- 2 police department shall submit a report to the center. The
- 3 report shall document the use of the grant funds by the police
- 4 <u>department</u>.
- 5 (h) Guidelines. -- The department shall adopt quidelines
- 6 necessary to implement and administer the provisions of this
- 7 section.
- 8 (i) Applicability. -- This section shall apply to fiscal years
- 9 beginning on or after July 1, 2016.
- 10 (j) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 11 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 12 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 13 <u>"Center." The Center for Local Government Services within</u>
- 14 the Department of Community and Economic Development of the
- 15 Commonwealth.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 17 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 18 "Grant." A grant awarded to a police department in
- 19 accordance with this section.
- 20 "Program." The Police Department Grant Program established
- 21 under this section.
- 22 Section 3. Repeals are as follows:
- 23 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under
- 24 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of 53
- 25 Pa.C.S. § 2172.
- 26 (2) The provisions of 4 Pa.C.S. § 1408(c) are repealed.
- 27 Section 4. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 28 (1) The following shall take effect immediately:
- (i) This section.
- 30 (ii) The addition of 53 Pa.C.S. § 2172.

- 1 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
- 2 days.
