## AN ACT

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, further 3 providing for possession of firearm by minor; and, in forfeitures, providing for disposition of forfeited firearms. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Section 6110.1(d) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 10 § 6110.1. Possession of firearm by minor. \* \* \* 11 12 (d) Forfeiture. -- Any firearm in the possession of a person under 18 years of age in violation of this section shall be 13 promptly seized by the arresting law enforcement officer and 14 15 upon conviction or adjudication of delinquency shall be 16 [forfeited]: 17 (1) forfeited and disposed of in accordance with 42 18 Pa.C.S. § 6803 (relating to disposition of forfeited 19 firearms); or[,]

- 1 (2) if stolen, returned to the lawful owner.
- 2 Section 2. Title 42 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 3 § 6803. Disposition of forfeited firearms.
- 4 (a) Prescribed actions. -- Whenever a firearm is required to
- 5 be forfeited under this chapter, 18 Pa.C.S. § 6110.1(d)
- 6 (relating to possession of firearm by minor) or any other law,
- 7 the court shall order the appropriate agency to take one of the
- 8 following actions:
- 9 <u>(1) Relinquish ownership of the firearm to the</u>
- 10 appropriate Federal law enforcement agency.
- 11 (2) Retain the firearm for official use by the agency
- 12 <u>and the prosecuting authority.</u>
- 13 (3) Sell the firearm to a federally licensed firearms
- dealer and distribute the proceeds as required by this
- chapter.
- 16 (4) Conduct a sale of the firearm at public auction.
- 17 Before the highest bidder at the public auction takes
- 18 possession of the firearm, the applicable background checks
- 19 shall be completed. If the results of the applicable
- 20 background checks indicate that the highest bidder is not
- 21 eligible to take possession of the firearm, the highest
- 22 bidder shall not be entitled to a refund of any incurred
- 23 costs associated with the background checks or the public
- 24 auction.
- 25 (b) Proceeds.--Proceeds resulting from the sale of a firearm
- 26 under subsection (a) shall be used to cover the agency's
- 27 personnel, equipment and training costs.
- 28 (c) Definition. -- As used in this section, the term "firearm"
- 29 includes any ammunition and accessories included with a
- 30 forfeited firearm.

1 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
