## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- Consolidated Statutes, in assault, providing for the offense
  - of harassment of law enforcement officer; and imposing
- 4 penalties.

- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 2703.2 Harassment of law enforcement officer.
- 10 (a) Offense defined.--Except as provided in sections 2703
- 11 <u>(relating to assault by prisoner)</u>, 2703.1 (relating to
- 12 aggravated harassment by prisoner) and 2704 (relating to assault
- 13 by life prisoner), a person is guilty of harassment of law
- 14 enforcement officer if the person intentionally or knowingly
- 15 <u>causes or attempts to cause a law enforcement officer to come</u>
- 16 into contact with blood, seminal fluid, saliva, urine or feces
- 17 by throwing, tossing, spitting or expelling such fluid or
- 18 material.

- 1 (b) Grading. -- An offense under this section is a felony of
- 2 the third degree if, at the time of the offense, the person
- 3 knew, had reason to know, should have known or believed such
- 4 <u>fluid or material to have been obtained from an individual,</u>
- 5 <u>including the person charged under this section</u>, infected by a
- 6 <u>communicable disease</u>, including, but not limited to, human
- 7 <u>immunodeficiency virus (HIV) or hepatitis B. Otherwise, the</u>
- 8 offense constitutes a misdemeanor of the first degree.
- 9 (c) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "law
- 10 enforcement officer" shall have the same meaning as the term
- 11 "peace officer" is given under section 501 (relating to
- 12 definitions).
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
