1 2 3 4	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, providing for firearm and firearm parts without serial numbers.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	§ 6110.3. Firearm and firearm parts without serial numbers.
10	(a) General Rule
11	(1) A person who sells any of the following, separately
12	or as part of a firearm kit, not imprinted with a serial
13	number registered with a Federal firearms licensee, commits a
14	felony of the second degree:
15	(i) A firearm frame or receiver;
16	(ii) A firearm muffler or silencer frame or
17	receiver;

1	(iii) A split or modular firearm frame or receiver;
2	<u>or</u>
3	(iv) A partially complete, disassembled or
4	inoperable firearm frame or receiver.
5	(2) A person who, with the purpose to manufacture or
6	otherwise assemble a firearm and without being registered or
7	licensed to do so under 18 U.S.C. § 923(a) (relating to
8	licensing), purchases or otherwise obtains separately or as
9	part of a firearm kit any of the following which is not
10	imprinted with a serial number registered with a Federal
11	firearms licensee, commits a felony of the second degree:
12	(i) A firearm frame or receiver;
13	(ii) A firearm muffler or silencer frame or
14	receiver;
15	(iii) A split or modular firearm frame or receiver;
16	<u>or</u>
17	(iv) A partially complete, disassembled or
18	inoperable firearm frame or receiver.
19	(3) For the purposes of this section, the sale, purchase
20	or acquisition of a destroyed firearm frame or receiver shall
21	not constitute an offense.
22	(b) Privately made firearms
23	(1) A Federal firearm licensee shall:
24	(i) Regarding a privately made firearm which was
25	acquired prior to the effective date of this section and
26	which is still in the possession of the licensee, conduct
27	one of the following within 60 days of the effective date
28	of this section or prior to the date of disposition,
29	whichever is sooner:
30	(A) properly mark the firearm, unless already

1	<u>marked by another licensee;</u>
2	(B) arrange to have another licensee properly
3	mark the firearm on their behalf; or
4	(C) destroy or surrender the firearm to law
5	enforcement.
6	(ii) Regarding a privately made firearm which is
7	acquired by a licensee after the effective date of this
8	section, conduct one of the following within seven days
9	following the date of receipt or other acquisition of the
10	firearm, including from a personal collection or before
11	the date of disposition, whichever is sooner:
12	(A) properly mark the firearm, unless already
13	marked by another licensee;
14	(B) arrange for another Federal firearms
15	licensee to properly mark the firearm; or
16	(C) destroy or surrender the firearm to law
17	enforcement.
18	(iii) Record privately made firearms in the Federal
19	firearms licensee's acquisition and disposition records,
20	whether or not kept overnight and update acquisition
21	entries with information marked on privately made
22	<u>firearms.</u>
23	(2) Federal firearms licensees who are dealers or
24	gunsmiths may not perform repairs, modify, embellish,
25	refurbish or install parts in or on firearms, firearm frames
26	or receivers or other firearm parts for or on behalf of a
27	licensed importer or licensed manufacturer.
28	(3) Federal firearms licensees shall have the right to
29	refuse to accept, purchase, properly mark, perform repairs,
30	modify, embellish, refurbish or install parts in or on any

- privately made firearms.
- 2 (4) For the purposes of this subsection, the term
- 3 "properly mark" shall mean the legible and conspicuous
- 4 <u>identification of each frame or receiver of a firearm subject</u>
- 5 to the identification procedures in 27 CFR 478.92 (relating
- 6 <u>to identification of firearms and armor piercing ammunition</u>
- 7 <u>by licensed manufacturers and licensed importers).</u>
- 8 (c) Exemption. -- The provisions of subsection (a) shall not
- 9 apply to a Federal firearms licensee who:
- 10 (1) Purchases or otherwise obtains a firearm frame or
- firearm receiver, uses the firearm frame or receiver in the
- 12 <u>assembly of a firearm and places a serial number on the</u>
- completed firearm as required under subsection (b).
- 14 (2) Obtains a privately made firearm for the purpose of
- marking described in subsection (b).
- 16 (d) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 17 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 18 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 19 <u>"Conspicuous." Identification markings that are capable of</u>
- 20 being easily seen with normal handling of the firearm and
- 21 unobstructed by other markings when the complete firearm is
- 22 <u>assembled</u>.
- "Destroyed firearm frame or receiver." A frame or receiver
- 24 that has been permanently altered not to provide housing or a
- 25 structure that may hold or integrate any fire control or
- 26 essential internal component, is not readily convertible and may
- 27 not readily be assembled, completed or restored to a functional
- 28 state. Acceptable methods of destruction include completely
- 29 melting, crushing or shredding the frame or receiver or
- 30 completely severing at least three critical areas of the frame

- 1 or receiver using a cutting torch having a tip of sufficient
- 2 <u>size to displace at least 1/4 inch of material at each location.</u>
- 3 "Federal firearms licensee." A dealer, manufacturer or
- 4 importer who is licensed by the United States Bureau of Alcohol,
- 5 Tobacco, Firearms and Explosive to engage in the business of
- 6 manufacturing, importing or dealing in firearms.
- 7 "Fire control or essential internal component." A component
- 8 necessary for the firearm to initiate, complete or continue the
- 9 firing sequence, including a hammer, bolt, bolt carrier,
- 10 breechblock, cylinder, trigger mechanism, firing pin, striker or
- 11 <u>slide rails.</u>
- 12 <u>"Firearm." Any weapon which is designed to or is readily</u>
- 13 convertible to expel any projectile by the action of an
- 14 <u>explosive or the frame or receiver of any weapon.</u>
- 15 <u>"Firearm frame or receiver." A part of a firearm that, when</u>
- 16 <u>assembled</u>, is visible from the exterior and provides housing or
- 17 a structure designed to hold or integrate one or more fire
- 18 control components, including pins, a hammer, bolts, a bolt
- 19 carrier, breechblock, cylinder, trigger mechanism, firing pin,
- 20 striker, slide rail or other attachments that are required to
- 21 connect components to the housing or structure necessary for the
- 22 firearm to initiate, complete or continue a firing sequence.
- 23 <u>"Firearm kit." Any collection of most or all of the</u>
- 24 components, finished or unfinished, necessary to complete a
- 25 <u>functional firearm within a short period of time. The term</u>
- 26 includes jigs, templates, instructions, drill bits and tools
- 27 that allow the purchaser to complete the weapon to a functional
- 28 state with minimal effort, expertise or equipment.
- 29 <u>"Firearm muffler or silencer frame or receiver." A part of</u>
- 30 the firearm that, when the complete device is assembled, is

- 1 <u>visible from the exterior and provides housing or a structure</u>,
- 2 including an outer tube or modular piece designed to hold or
- 3 <u>integrate one or more essential internal components of the</u>
- 4 <u>device</u>, including a baffle, baffling material or expansion
- 5 chamber.
- 6 "Legible." Identification markings that use exclusively
- 7 Roman letters and Arabic numerals, or solely Arabic numerals,
- 8 and may include a hyphen.
- 9 <u>"Partially complete, disassembled or inoperable firearm frame</u>
- 10 or receiver." A frame or receiver that has reached a stage in
- 11 manufacture where it may readily be completed, assembled or
- 12 <u>restored to a functional state or is readily convertible to a</u>
- 13 <u>functional state. The term includes a forging, casting,</u>
- 14 printing, extrusion, machined body or similar article that has
- 15 <u>reached a stage in manufacture where it is clearly identifiable</u>
- 16 <u>as an unfinished component part of a weapon.</u>
- 17 "Privately made firearm." A firearm or firearm frame or
- 18 receiver, assembled or otherwise produced by a person other than
- 19 a Federal firearms licensee that does not contain a serial
- 20 number or other identifying markings placed by a Federal
- 21 firearms licensee at the time the firearm was produced.
- 22 <u>"Readily convertible." Any object that can be so converted</u>
- 23 without any special skill on the part of the person converting
- 24 it and the work involved in converting it does not require
- 25 equipment or tools other than such as are in common use by
- 26 persons carrying out works of construction and maintenance in
- 27 <u>their own homes.</u>
- 28 "Split or modular firearm frame or receiver." A firearm with
- 29 more than one part that provides housing or a structure designed
- 30 to hold or integrate one or more fire control or essential

- 1 <u>internal components</u>. The term shall include frames or receivers
- 2 of different weapons that are combined to create a similar
- 3 weapon with each retaining respective classifications as frames
- 4 or receivers provided the original design and configuration of
- 5 the frames or receivers remains unaltered.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
