AS AMENDED ON SECOND CONSIDERATION, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, JUNE 10, 2025

## AN ACT

- Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in Pennsylvania Game Commission, further providing 2 for organization of commission; in game or wildlife 3 protection, further providing for regulations, for report to commission officer, for surrender of carcass to commission 5 officer and for unlawful activities; and, in hunting and furtaking, repealing provisions relating to hunting on Sunday 7 prohibited, further providing for unlawful devices and 8 methods and for the offense of trespass on private property while hunting and repealing provisions relating to hunting on 10 Sunday without written permission. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- 14 Section 1. Section 301(a) of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania
- 15 Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by
- 16 adding subsections to read:
- § 301. Organization of commission. 17
- Composition. -- [The] Subject to subsection (b.1), the 18 (a)
- 19 independent administrative commission known as the Pennsylvania
- 20 Game Commission shall consist of nine competent citizens of this
- 21 Commonwealth who shall be well informed on the subject of
- 22 wildlife conservation and restoration and who shall be appointed

- 1 by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of a
- 2 majority of the elected members of the Senate.

- 4 (b.1) Additional consideration. -- The Governor shall ensure
- 5 that at least one member of the commission represents the
- 6 <u>interest of agricultural commodities that pertain to normal</u>
- 7 agricultural operations and wildlife.

- 9 (e) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 10 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 11 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 <u>"Agricultural commodity." As defined in section 2 of the act</u>
- 13 <u>of June 10, 1982 (P.L.454, No.133), referred to as the Right-to-</u>
- 14 Farm Law.
- 15 "Normal agricultural operation." As defined in section 2 of
- 16 <u>the Right-to-Farm Law.</u>
- 17 Section 2. Sections 2102(b)(2), 2122 and 2125 of Title 34
- 18 are amended to read:
- 19 § 2102. Regulations.

- 21 (b) Seasons, possession, bag limits and devices.--
- 22 \* \* \*
- 23 (2) If in any year the commission fails to establish
- seasons or bag limits or fails to establish other hunting or
- furtaking regulations under authority of this title, the open
- seasons and bag limits for game or furbearers[, Sundays
- excepted], unless otherwise provided by this title, and all
- other hunting or furtaking regulations adopted under
- 29 authority of this title, shall be the same as set by
- regulation of the commission for the previous license year,

- 1 and all seasons shall open and close one calendar day earlier
- 2 than the previous license year. In the event the commission
- 3 fails to establish seasons and bag limits for a license year
- 4 beginning in a leap year, the seasons shall open and close
- 5 two calendar days earlier than the previous license year.

- 7 § 2122. Report to commission officer.
- 8 Any person who kills any game or wildlife, other than
- 9 raccoons, under the provisions of this subchapter shall, within
- 10 24 hours, report, orally or in writing, the killing to an
- 11 officer of the commission. The report shall set forth the date,
- 12 time and place of the killing, the number of species killed
- 13 [and] the sex of the species[.] and the location of each
- 14 <u>carcass. The commission shall establish a self-reporting system</u>
- 15 that allows a person assigned to remove deer for crop damage
- 16 purposes to report each harvest to an officer of the commission
- 17 <u>via a toll-free telephone number, online application or publicly</u>
- 18 <u>accessible Internet website</u>.
- 19 § 2125. Surrender of carcass [to commission officer].
- 20 Except as otherwise provided in this subchapter, the entire
- 21 carcass, including the head and hide[,] of all big game animals
- 22 and the entire carcass of any other game or wildlife, other than
- 23 raccoons, <u>less entrails</u>, shall be made available, unless
- 24 otherwise directed by an officer of the commission, intact[,
- 25 less entrails, ] to any commission officer calling for them[.] or
- 26 delivered to a processor for final disposition. As used in this
- 27 <u>section, the term "processor" means a location specified by the</u>
- 28 commission that is willing to accept donations of animals taken
- 29 <u>under this chapter</u>.

- 5 person while acting under the provisions of this subchapter to:

- permission is a summary offense of the third degree.
- 14 Section 4. Section 2303 of Title 34 is repealed:
- 15 [\$ 2303. Hunting on Sunday prohibited.
- 16 (a) General rule. -- Except as otherwise provided in this
- 17 title, it is unlawful for any person to hunt for any furbearer
- 18 or game on Sunday.
- (b) Construction of section. -- This section shall not be
- 20 construed to prohibit:
- 21 (1) The training of dogs.
- (2) The participation in dog trials as provided for in
- this title.
- 24 (3) The removal of lawfully taken game or wildlife from
- traps or the resetting of the traps on Sunday.
- (b.1) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to:
- 27 (1) The hunting of foxes.
- 28 (2) The hunting of coyotes.
- 29 (3) Any hunting which occurs on noncommercial regulated
- hunting grounds holding a valid permit under section 2928(b)

1 (2) (relating to regulated hunting grounds permits). 13	(a) [General rule] <u>Trespass</u> A person, while engaged in	
14	hunting or furtaking, commits an offense if, knowing that the	
15	person is not licensed or privileged to do so, the person:	
16	(1) enters or remains on any land of another without	
17	authorization to do so, when the land is posted in a manner	
18	prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the	
19	person's attention [or is fenced or enclosed in a manner	
20	manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or];	
21	(2) enters or remains on any land of another without	
22	authorization and defies an order not to enter or to leave	
23	that has been personally communicated to the person by the	
24	owner of the land or other authorized person[.];	
25	(3) enters or remains on any land of another without	
26	authorization to do so, when the land is fenced or enclosed	
27	in a manner manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or	
28	(4) subject to subsection (b), enters or remains on any	
29	land of another without authorization to do so when notice

- 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) A person who violates subsection (a) (1), (3) or (4)
- 8 commits a summary offense of the [third degree.] <u>second</u>
- 9 degree and may result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt
- or take game or wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth
- for a period of up to one year.

- misdemeanor[.] and shall result in forfeiture of the
- 14 <u>privilege to hunt or take game or wildlife anywhere within</u>
- this Commonwealth for a period of three years.

- 3 Sunday prohibited), the person enters private land without
- 4 obtaining written permission of the landowner, an agent of the
- 5 landowner or lessee.
- 6 (b) Penalty. -- A person who violates subsection (a) commits a
- 7 summary offense of the third degree.]
- 8 Section 8. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
