AN ACT

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses), 23 (Domestic 1 Relations) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in offenses against the 3 family, further providing for the offense of endangering welfare of children; in child protective services, further providing for definitions and for exclusions from child 5 6 abuse; and, in juvenile matters, further providing for 7 definitions. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 4304(a)(1) and (2) of Title 18 of the 12 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section 13 is amended by adding a subsection to read: § 4304. Endangering welfare of children. 14 15 (a) Offense defined. --16 (1)[A] Except as provided in subsection (a.1), a 17 parent, quardian or other person supervising the welfare of a 18 child under 18 years of age, or a person that employs or 19 supervises such a person, commits an offense if he knowingly 20 endangers the welfare of the child by violating a duty of

- 1 care, protection or support.
- 2 (2) [A] Except as provided in subsection (a.1), a person
- 3 commits an offense if the person, in an official capacity,
- 4 prevents or interferes with the making of a report of
- 5 suspected child abuse under 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to
- 6 child protective services).

- 8 (a.1) Exceptions. -- It shall not be considered an offense
- 9 under subsection (a) if:
- 10 (1) the conduct does not constitute abuse as defined in
- 23 Pa.C.S. § 6102 (relating to definitions); or
- 12 (2) the child is not a dependent child as defined in 42
- Pa.C.S. § 6302 (relating to definitions).

- 16 section 6303(a) of Title 23 is amended to read:
- 17 § 6303. Definitions.
- 18 (a) General rule. -- The following words and phrases when used
- 19 in this chapter shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 20 section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- "Serious physical neglect." Any of the following when
- 23 committed by a perpetrator that endangers a child's life or
- 24 health, threatens a child's well-being, causes bodily injury or
- 25 impairs a child's health, development or functioning:
- 26 (1) A repeated, prolonged or egregious failure to
- supervise a child in a manner that is [appropriate] necessary
- considering the child's developmental age and abilities.
- 29 (2) The deliberate failure to provide a child with
- 30 [adequate] essentials of life, including food, shelter or

- 7 (d.1) Supervision and independent activities. --
- 8 (1) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to
- 9 <u>restrict the rights of a parent to determine the level of</u>
- 10 <u>supervision given to a child in a manner that is appropriate</u>
- 11 <u>considering the child's development and abilities.</u>
- 12 (2) A parent may permit a child of sufficient maturity
- to engage in independent activities, including:
- (i) Traveling to and from school, including walking,
- 15 running or bicycling.
- (ii) Traveling to and from nearby commercial or
- 17 recreational facilities.
- 18 (iii) Engaging in outdoor play.
- 19 (iv) Notwithstanding 75 Pa.C.S. § 3701.1 (relating
- to leaving an unattended child in a motor vehicle),
- 21 <u>remaining in a vehicle unattended.</u>
- 22 (v) Remaining at home or in a location unattended.
- 23 <u>(vi) Providing care for younger siblings or family</u>
- members.

- 2 recklessly disregards an obvious A FORESEEABLE danger to the <--
- 3 child for which a reasonable and prudent parent would take
- 4 precautionary measures to prevent subjecting the child to an
- 5 unreasonable risk of serious harm.

- 8 child" in section 6302 of Title 42 is amended to read:
- 9 § 6302. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 11 shall have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
- 12 meanings given to them in this section:
- 13 * * *
- "Dependent child." A child who:
- 15 (1) is without [proper] parental care or control,
- subsistence, education as required by law, or other care or
- 17 control necessary for his physical, mental, or emotional
- health[, or morals]. A determination that there is a lack of
- 19 [proper] parental care or control [may] shall be based upon
- 20 evidence of conduct by the parent, quardian or other
- 21 custodian that places the health, safety or welfare of the
- 22 child at [risk,] <u>serious and likely risk of harm,</u> including
- evidence of the parent's, guardian's or other custodian's use
- of alcohol or a controlled substance that places the health,
- safety or welfare of the child at [risk;] serious and likely <--
- risk of harm, but this paragraph shall not be construed to
- 27 restrict the rights of a parent to determine the level of
- 28 supervision given to a child in a manner that is appropriate
- 29 <u>considering the child's development and abilities;</u>

- 1 Section 5. All regulations and parts of regulations are
- 2 abrogated to the extent of any inconsistency with this act.
- 3 Section 6. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
