A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of August 17 through 23, 2025, as "Social Media Safety and Parental Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Sextortion is a rapidly growing form of online child
- 4 exploitation in which predators coerce victims into sharing
- 5 explicit images or videos and then threaten to distribute the
- 6 content unless specific demands are met; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In 2024, the National Center for Missing and
- 8 Exploited Children's CyberTipline received 20.5 million reports
- 9 of suspected child sexual exploitation; and
- 10 WHEREAS, This number includes 546,000 cases of online
- 11 enticement, a 192% increase from 2023; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Among persons under 28 years of age, exposure to
- 13 sexual imagery began around 13 years of age; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Among teens, one in five have experienced
- 15 sextortion; and
- 16 WHEREAS, An estimated 17% of teen victims were 12 years of
- 17 age or younger when first sextorted; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Teenage boys, 13 to 17 years of age, are most
- 2 frequently targeted; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Victims as young as 8 years of age have been
- 4 reported; and
- 5 WHEREAS, While boys comprise the majority of sextortion
- 6 victims, there has been a 2,600% increase in reports involving
- 7 girls; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The threat to children and teens is rapidly
- 9 expanding across all demographics; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Reports involving artificial intelligence (AI),
- 11 including deepfake images used for online abuse, grew by 1,325%
- 12 in 2024, with more than 67,000 incidents on record; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Predators increasingly use AI to impersonate victims
- 14 or to generate fake explicit images and fake job postings as
- 15 part of larger sextortion and trafficking schemes; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Affected children and teens may experience severe
- 17 psychological trauma; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Among young victims, one in seven reported self-harm
- 19 in response to sextortion attempts; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Approximately 81% of sextortion incidents occur
- 21 entirely online through social media and messaging platforms;
- 22 and
- 23 WHEREAS, Approximately 98% of sextortion incidents are never
- 24 reported to law enforcement; and
- 25 WHEREAS, While most platforms require users to be at least 13
- 26 years of age, nearly 40% of children 8 to 12 years of age are
- 27 already using social media; and
- WHEREAS, Beyond this, 95% of teens 13 to 17 years of age are
- 29 using at least one social media platform; and
- 30 WHEREAS, These numbers highlight the growing exposure of

- 1 minors to online environments at increasingly younger ages; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Awareness among parents, schools, law enforcement
- 3 and students is essential to protecting young people from the
- 4 dangers of social media; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The beginning of the school year presents an
- 6 important opportunity for families and communities to consider
- 7 online safety and other protective behaviors; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of August 17
- 9 through 23, 2025, as "Social Media Safety and Parental Awareness
- 10 Week" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage engagement in educational
- 12 programming and public awareness efforts that prevent
- 13 sextortion, protect minors from online exploitation and
- 14 highlight the dangers of social media as students prepare to
- 15 return to school in our communities.
